* The Capacity Reservation Fee offsets the costs that BexarMet incurs in getting water to the service location. This fee is combined with the Volumetric Charge on the BexarMet bill and does not appear by itself unless water was not used at the location during the billing period.

** The System Improvement fee offsets the costs that BexarMet incurs while making improvements to infrastructure and related elements within the water system.

*** The EAA Management Fee is a pass through fee that goes to pay for regulatory assessments made by resources from which BexarMet obtains water, in this case, the Edwards Aquifer Authority and the Trinity Glen Rose Groundwater Conservation District. At one time, only the EAA was charging regulatory fees to BexarMet, hence the name of the fee.
