



# LEVEL 3 WATER ADVISORY CANCELLED

## Stage 2 Restrictions Activated

**Target: Achieve a 10% reduction in overall water use.**

Effective Saturday, October 10, 2009, BexarMet is **cancelling** Level 3 of the District's Drought Contingency Plan and **activating** Stage 2 restrictions until further notice due to the following trigger criteria:

- 1) ***Average daily water use exceeds 85% of system production capacity for three consecutive days.***

### **WATER USE RESTRICTIONS**

**The following Stage 2 restrictions apply to all BexarMet customers in Anaqua Springs, Timberwood Park, Canyon Springs and Lookout Canyon:**

- 1) Outdoor watering with automatic or hose-end sprinklers, drip irrigation and soaker hoses is permitted once per week based on the last digit of the address (See below). **Common areas and medians are to be set for Wednesday watering.**
- 2) Sprinkler watering permitted 3am to 8am and 8pm to 10pm only on the designated day.
- 3) Watering with hand-held hose or bucket permitted any time, on any day.
- 4) **No SPRINKLER watering of any kind on weekends.**
- 5) Soaker hoses allowed for use during hand watering hours around foundations to minimize shifting.
- 6) Operation of fountains and decorative water features prohibited unless to support aquatic life.
- 7) All pools must be covered at least 25% when not in use. Use inflatable toys, a cover or other means.
- 8) Wash vehicles at home on the designated watering day, during sprinkler hours. Use a shut off device on the hose to reduce runoff.
- 9) Irrigation variances will be issued beginning Tuesday, October 13, 2009 for installing new landscapes. Variances good for three weeks from date of landscape installation.
- 10) All water waste is prohibited, including washing driveways, buildings, allowing runoff water, and unrepaired leaks.
- 11) Sprinklers from aerobic septic systems are exempt from this advisory.

***\*\* This advisory remains in effect until further notice and supersedes all other notices. \*\****

Thank you for your cooperation during this extreme drought. During the past 30 days, well output in Timberwood Park has risen 10% while storage tank levels have remained full, providing ample water for indoor use and fire protection.
